DOPING VIOLATION

Queensland Rams baseball player Brett Montgomery's three-month ban for cannabis

The Australian Baseball Federation's decision to impose a three-month sanction on Queensland Rams baseball player Brett Montgomery for returning a positive test for cannabis was today welcomed by the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority (ASADA).

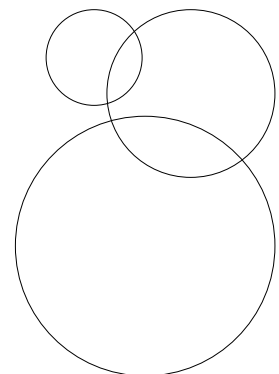
ASADA collected an in-competition sample from Mr Montgomery on 18 December 2009 after a Claxton Shield baseball match between Queensland and Victoria at Holloway Field in Brisbane. This sample tested positive for cannabis.

Cannabis is referred to as a specified substance on the 2010 World Anti-Doping Code Prohibited List and is prohibited in-competition. Sanctions can range from a minimum of a warning to a maximum of four years ineligibility.

Mr Montgomery is banned from taking part in recognised sports for a period of three months and can resume competing on 9 May 2010.
